Principal's Message

Dear Parents,

Performance Night

Helicopter

Planning

Emergency Procedures Practice

All schools have procedures in place to deal with the unlikely event of emergency situations arising at school. These include evacuation, lock-down and off-site evacuation procedures. Schools are required to hold regular practices of the procedures so that in the event of a genuine emergency the students are familiar with the routines and expectations. Next week two of these practices have been scheduled, and will include a lock-down and an off-site evacuation which will involve the students walking to Mark's Oval. If you happen to be at school when the practices occur please understand that you will be expected to follow the directions of staff and participate in the practice, just as if it were a "real" situation.

Classroom Painting

Several of our classrooms are about to receive a freshen-up with a new coat of paint. The work will commence on Monday next week and will be organised to minimise disruption to the normal operation of the classes and school.

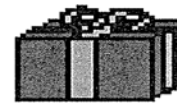

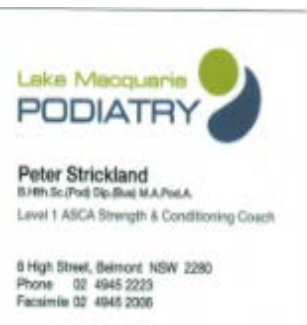
