PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE WEEK 9 TERM 4

Dear Parents,

Enrichment Opportunities

At Floraville, we pride ourselves on providing a quality education for every child. We aim to cater for individual students' needs, whether that be through enrichment opportunities, withdrawal groups for learning assistance or adjusted programs in the classroom. As most of you will know, the enrichment class program has been a long running component of our school structure. The class/es have been designed to enrich the learning of students identified as high achieving or potentially gifted and talented.

We have seen some changes to the enrichment opportunities over recent years and these changes are continuing to evolve. Last year we sought feedback from parents as well as students and staff. After considering this feedback and in line with current DEC policy regarding a focus on meeting the individual learning needs of all students we are making further changes to enrichment opportunities at Floraville to help us cater for a wider range of students across all key learning areas.

From 2015 we will be replacing the enrichment classes with structures that will allow us to identify and cater more widely for students' strengths as well as areas of need. This will begin with the introduction of graded ability groupings across Years 3 to 6. The first subject area to see this will be Mathematics from Term 1. Students will be streamed and will undertake maths lessons in these groups with students of similar ability. The aim is to enable the teachers to more effectively target the learning to the needs of

the group and will mean that students are receiving instruction in a group working at their level of ability. This scenario promotes students' strengths and interests and accommodates for a more realistic view that many students may have a strength in one key learning area and not all key learning areas.

After the success of this initiative is reviewed other subject areas may be included.

In conjunction with the streamed groupings we are also introducing regular enrichment sessions across the school where students with a particular talent or area of expertise/interest will be invited to participate in learning experiences that will extend their understandings and enrich their learning in these area, examples may include a technology group, a visual arts group, a creative writing group, etc.

We thank everyone for their valuable feedback and look forward to these exciting opportunities in 2015.

Water Catchers Video

Congratulations to the students and staff involved in the Hunter Water -Water Catchers short film competition. A group of students, staff and parents attended the official screening of the finalist's videos last Friday at the Tower Cinemas in Newcastle. It was great to see our video (written by Grace Ellis) on the big screen and we were thrilled to be announced as the overall winner. The prize included \$10 000 for the school which will be put to good use supporting some of our curriculum and environmental initiatives.

Parliament Education Rebate
