Process: How to Raise a Concern

From time to time parents and carers may have a specific concern they would like to raise with the school. The concern may relate to their child's wellbeing or other particular learning needs. The first step is to arrange to speak with the child's class teacher. As well as responsibilities for class teaching, our teaching staff have other accountabilities before and after school. To ensure their availability, it is best to make an appointment to speak with the teacher. This can be done by calling the office or sending an email to the school. When a concern has been raised with the teacher and requires additional support, the Assistant Principal may become involved. An Assistant Principal leads each of our Stage teams, as noted in the table, below. The Deputy Principal manages the day-to-day running of the school, while the Principal manages whole-school operations and performance. Both the Deputy and Principal are available to assist students and families where there is a need beyond the initial support provided.

LIBRARY NEWS

'Bring Back The Book' Reading Challenge

During the first 4 weeks of Term 4, students will be participating in a special 'Bring Back the Book' Reading Challenge. This will hopefully serve as a reminder that in our busy worlds, reading is key to success and can also be a source of enjoyment. There will be two key components to the challenge, a Grade Challenge and an Individual Challenge.

Grade Challenge

Classes compete against other classes in their grade, with the winning class being the class who has read the most books in the 4 week period.

Students will record books they've read on a 'Bookmometer' (like a thermometer but it measures books read) which will be on display in each classroom.

Individual Challenge

Students will be given a reading ideas sheet which will hopefully give them some interesting and inspirational reading suggestions. When a student reads either 1 chapter book or 4 shorter reads they are then eligible to complete an entry and go into the draw to win a \$50 Book Club voucher. Entry forms are available in all classrooms or in the library or at the end of this document if you'd like to fill them out at home. Entries will need to be taken to the library and put in the entry box. At the end of each week, 4 infant's students and 4 primary students will win a \$50 Book Club voucher, randomly drawn from the completed entries. The more books read, the greater the chance of winning. Books can include home readers and can also include books read to a student. Note: Only books read within the 4 week period can be included; Beginning on Monday 15th October and ending on Friday 9th November.

OPAL CARDS

School student applications for 2019 open from Monday, 15 October 2018.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 do not need to re-apply if they:

- · are continuing at the same school
- · are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.
