#### **PSSA Knock Out Competitions 2019**

In Week 7, we surveyed all students currently in Years 3, 4 and 5 regarding what PSSA Knock Out Teams they would like to trial for next year. #### Please note:

Soccer: We will still enter junior and senior soccer teams in Macquarie Cup 2019.

AFL, Girls Cricket, Hockey, Basketball, Softball and Rugby Union: We do not have enough student interest to enter a competitive team in the Knock Out competition. We hope to offer these sports in weekly sport rotations and/ or in development clinics with future sporting grants.

Other sports: We are still able to select and send talented sports people to trial for Zone PSSA teams in any PSSA sport.

#### **OPAL CARDS**

School student applications for 2019 are currently open.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 do not need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <u>https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</u>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.
