Stocktake

At the end of each year, we conduct a stocktake in the library. It helps us to find missing books and get the shelves and our computer system organised. So far, we have done a stocktake on our Non-Fiction collection and our Fiction collection (chapter books) and it is interesting to note that there are 23 books in Non-Fiction that have pretty much disappeared and 89 Fiction books. This probably equates to over \$1000 worth of books. This doesn't include any books that are on loan or any books that students have lost throughout the year.
