CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) UPDATE

COVID-19 Guidelines November 2020

Attendance

- Parents and carers are reminded **NOT** to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. Students and staff with flu-like symptoms will need to be tested and provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result and be symptom-free before being permitted to return to school.
- Students who do not undertake a COVID-19 test result will not be permitted to return to school for a 10 day period. Additionally, they must be symptom-free for at least 3 days prior to returning to school.

Parents

- Parents and carers are not allowed on school sites or at offsite school events held during school hours except for the following purposes only:
- Essential parent and carer meetings with teachers and/or school executives
- Picking up their child if they are unwell or where they have been asked to arrange for a COVID-19 test after their child has displayed flu-like symptoms while at school
- Canteen and uniform shop duties or to collect or purchase uniforms
- Being in an educational support role for activities that are essential to the delivery of the curriculum
- Attending special end of year events at the invitation of the school, provided that these events can be hosted while maintaining a COVID-safe environment.

Students

- Where possible, students will stay within their relevant cohort group (i.e. class, year group, or stage) for all learning activities within their school in order to limit close contacts to the relevant student cohort.
- Singing and musical activities must adhere to the Department's guidelines for singing, musical activities and creative arts.
- Students and their parents and carers will need to be aware that graduation and award ceremonies (Presentation Day) will be conducted in accordance with the COVID-19 Safety Plan for graduation ceremonies to ensure a COVID-Safe environment for all attendees.

Requirements include:

• Guests will be invited based on the total number of people (this includes staff, students, parents & carer or visitors) who are able to be accommodated under the 4 square metre rule.

Activities on hold

- Activities that involve gathering of parent and community members such as parent functions, working bees, school barbecues, parent information evenings and on-site cultural events
- Parent and carer attendance at assemblies and other school activities unless it's an end of year school event as specified above and the venue can cater for the 4 squared metre distancing rule.
- School Formals can proceed for all year groups from 12 November 2020. All events must have a COVID-19 safety plan in place. Attendance is limited to the student cohort and supervising staff only.
- Carols by candle light events remain on hold
- Community social events or functions, fundraisers, fetes and barbecues are not permitted in Term 4.


News From The Office

- If you need to pick up children early or take them for an appointment, please make sure that you:
 - Send a message to the teacher to let them know.
 - Phone or email the school to let us know in the morning.
 - Come in to the office to collect your child and we will get them to come to the office, as you cannot go to the classroom.
 - Remember that it can be hard to find children at break times: 1st break 11:00-11:30, 2nd break 1:30-2:10 Mon-Thu and 1:00-1:40 Fridays.
- If your child is unwell, please keep them home. If children are unwell at school, we will call you to pick them up from school. If children have cold/cough symptoms, they need to have a Covid test, which must be emailed to the school:

TRADITIONAL INDIGENOUS GAMES

'kal-ka-doon kee-an

Il school-age groups (K-12)

Background

In areas of north Queensland, a game of throwing skill was played. A large bone, such as an emu shinbone, with twine attached to it was thrown in to a pit or hole.

Short description

The game involves throwing a ball into a small bin target as many times as possible.

Equipment

- Use 'foxtail' or a tennis ball in a stocking (or long football sock) as the bone.
- Use a large plastic bin or hoop as the pit or hole.

Game play and basic rules

- Play singly or in groups of two to four players.
- Players line up behind one another in their groups.
- Players hold the foxtail a short distance away from the ball and take it in turns to attempt to throw the foxtail ball in to the bin or hoop from 3-5 metres away.
- To avoid interference, the player throwing the foxtail is 2 metres in front of the rest of the line of players (mark a line for this)
- As an extra challenge, the balls are held further down the tail.

Scoring

- Players can keep score of successful throw for a set time (2-3 minutes) or set number of turns (four to six).
- If using a hoop, score one point if the foxtail touches or bounces in and out of the hoop, and two points if it stays in the hoop.

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

Celebrating NAIDOC Week | 8-15 November 2020


This year's theme, 'Always Was, Always Will Be', recognises that First Nations people have occupied and cared for this continent for over 65,000 years.
